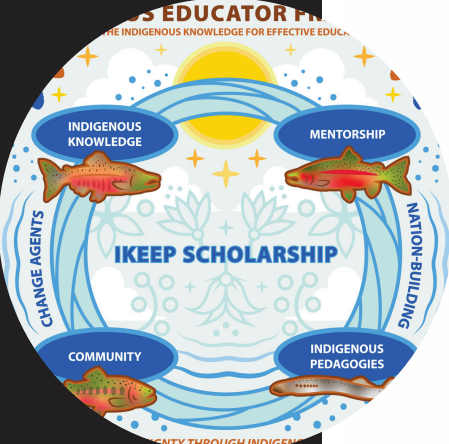
This cohort is for master's and education specialist candidates with a minimum of a bachelor's degree and at least one year of teaching experience in an Idaho classroom. Must be accepted into UI Graduate program in Education Leadership or Education Specialist degree

Indigenous Education Leadership: The University of Idaho's Indigenous Knowledge for Effective Education Program seeks applicants to join an Ed Leadership/Principle certification cohort.

Who Qualifies: Certified teachers serving a notable Indigenous population in Idaho and/or certified teachers working for one of the five Tribal Nations in Idaho. Priority given to enrolled Tribal citizens and descendants.

Scholar Support: Accepted applicants will receive partial tuition support, stipend to attend Indigenous-centered teaching and leadership summits, and the support of an IKEEP cohort.

Deadline to apply: March 1, 2025
