- Legislative week. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee (JFAC) is considering higher education budgets for next year. Information will be shared as it becomes available.
- From the **Office of General Counsel**. Sharing student information is prohibited by FERPA. If approached by law enforcement or federal agents on campus seeking information about students, please direct them to OGC.
- Anyone involved with **federal grants** should expect important communication from the Research Office and the Office of Sponsored Programs. Please reply promptly.
- The **University Budget and Finance Committee** worked hard this fall to review budget requests in partnership with the Department of Finance and Administration. This spring they anticipate looking at possibilities for salaries and the impact of the budget model on curricular choices.
