

## Zoom Videos Now Stored in the Zoom Cloud

Video storage for Zoom recordings has transitioned back to the Zoom cloud due to new storage constraints with our Microsoft contract. This move is beneficial for several reasons including improved functionality, ample room for video storage, the ability to utilize more features of Zoom AI Companion, and automatic audio transcription of Zoom cloud recordings. ## New Printing System for Student Lab and Kiosk Users



PaperCut, a new printing system in U of I's computer labs, is now in place. PaperCut makes the student lab printing experience more flexible and efficient. It offers easy-to-use features on computers or mobile devices for tracking print jobs, managing print quotas, and reducing waste. Users will be able to see their print information at [papercut.uidaho.edu](http://papercut.uidaho.edu).

To use PaperCut from a lab computer or a kiosk, students will print normally from any application using the UofI-MobilePrint queue. Then they'll go to any lab printer and release the prints by entering their Vandal ID number on the keypad or by scanning the QR code with a mobile device. Instructions are posted on all printers.

## Zoom AI Companion Now Available

Zoom AI Companion is the only AI meeting tool that has been reviewed for security and compliance and is approved for low-risk university use. The features available with Zoom AI Companion are Meeting Summaries, Meeting Questions, Smart Recording, Whiteboard Content Generation, and enhancements to Zoom Clips. Zoom AI Companion is turned off by default, but each employee can enable it within their Zoom settings. To learn more about the features and how to enable this tool, see [this article](#). No other AI meeting assistants or add-ons are currently approved due to privacy and security concerns. If you are using other AI meeting assistants or add-ons, you should disable them immediately. Also, be aware of AI bots that join as meeting participants and remove them from your meetings.
